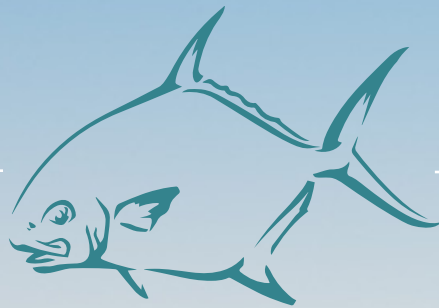

We are an Orvis-endorsed outfitter providing weeklong Honduras fly fishing trips to the Caribbean Island of Utila. Say hello to paradise! Our local guides are passionate about fishing, and their eagle eyes can make all the

difference when you're poling the flats for bonefish, permit, and tarpon. We promise that our truly welcoming local culture and incredible fishing make this an unforgettable trip.

TAKE ME TO PARADISE! HOW DO I GET THERE?

Our weeklong trips begin and end on Saturdays. You will need to schedule your domestic flight from the U.S. to Roatan (RTB), then we will schedule your puddle jumper or ferry leg to Utila and notify you of the cost.

- Charter flights to Utila are around \$500 for the plane, which carries up to 4 passengers. Costs are split among the passengers.
- The ferry is an air-conditioned modern vessel and tickets are about \$35 each way. Most of the domestic flights arrive too late Saturday afternoon to catch the ferry, but it is an option for the return trip.
 - Payment will be made to either the charter company or the ferry office on the day of travel. The charter is cash only and the ferry accepts cash and credit. Please be prepared with unmarked and unworn U.S. bills or Honduran Lempira.



GET HOOKED UP - YOUR ACCOMMODATIONS

Our 5-bedroom house boasts harbor views, a private dock where the guides pick you up each morning, a bocce and horseshoe pit, and an outdoor palapa on the water. You'll be just a short walk to the beach or one of the many amazing bars and restaurants. Our ideal weekly group size is 4 anglers, but larger groups can be accommodated with planning. We limit our group sizes to protect the fishery and to promote a sustainable fishing experience that continues to improve over each season. This also allows us to customize each trip and provide the best experience for each guest. Your hosts provide transportation to and from the airport on Utila, make dinner reservations, coordinate fishing schedules, and guides. Just get here and leave the rest up to us!



SAMPLE FLY FISH UTILA ITINERARY

Most domestic flights land in Roatan between noon and 2 pm. The 15-minute charter to Utila usually has our guests back at the house, enjoying a cold drink in time to catch the sun setting into the Caribbean sea. Non-alcoholic drinks are included and most all spirits, wine, and beer are available for purchase on the island. Here's what you can expect each day:



6:30 AM

Boats arrive, coolers and drinks are packed, rods and gear loaded, and an epic day of flats fishing begins. Breakfast and lunch are served on the boat.



3:00 - 4:00 PM

Return to the house to rinse off, swap fish stories, and relax until dinner.



6:00 - 7:00 PM

Dinner at a local restaurant like the mouthwatering Mammot Steakhouse or Mango Tango



I TOOK THE BAIT, HELP ME DECIDE ON A PACKAGE

Our packages are a 7-night lodging, 6 days guided fishing experience. Our \$4,000 Per Person Double Occupancy is for anglers who are traveling with a partner.

For those who are seeking single occupancy, we charge \$5,500 per angler.



Breakfast and lunch are included but guests are responsible for paying for their dinner. Please know your hosts will make all of your reservations and dinner arrangements. Dinner costs range from \$15-\$60 depending on the restaurant.

IN THE WEEDS- F.A.Q.

- U.S. passports must be valid for at least 6 months from the departure date.
- Exchange Rate: 1 USD = 24.5 Honduran Lempiras.
- There is an ATM on the island and it is a great way to get Lempiras at the going exchange rate. Remember to notify your bank and credit card companies that you will be traveling to Honduras on the specified dates.
- Although a few places take cards, it's not common so please bring cash. We recommend bringing enough U.S. currency with you to cover most of the trip expenses, and you can supplement this with lempiras from the ATM. Remember that U.S. currency must be in PERFECT condition, the slightest tear will make it unusable. This goes for your tip money as well. A torn bill will not be accepted by the bank or any businesses on the island and is essentially worthless. Cash envelopes from your bank are a great way to protect bills while traveling and also in your pocket – it's a good idea to grab a few extra envelopes to bring with you.
- We strongly encourage guests to purchase trip insurance to cover unforeseen circumstances. You can do so at <https://partner.globalrescue.com/flyfishutila/index.html>
- Suggested gratuity for the fishing guides is \$60-\$100/day.
- Suggested gratuity for our lovely cooks and cleaning staff are \$50-\$75/week.
- No fishing license is required, but we ask that each angler makes a \$10 donation to BICA, the Bay Islands Conservation Association. There is an office on Utila that guests can visit or we will be happy to drop your donation off for you.
- Most of the employees at our airport, ferry, grocery store, etc. all speak English.
